BizSafe is a Queensland Police Service problem-oriented and partnership policing (POPP) strategy introduced to assist businesses in preventing and reducing the risk of crime and is proudly supported by NRMA Business Insurance and the Department of Communities - Community Engagement Division.







BizSafe provides the opportunity for small to medium sized businesses in Queensland to work together with police to help reduce the risk of crime, through the delivery of introductory and elective workshops, security assessment forms and course manuals to business operators.

The Introductory Workshop, which runs for about two hours, gives participants:

-  facts about business crime in the local community, its prevalence and cost
-  an introduction to risk management and the risk assessment process
-  information about conducting a business security assessment
-  concrete strategies that can reduce crime risk.

At the end of the workshop, participants can choose from a list of topics they would like to learn more about. The local Police District Crime Prevention Coordinators will review the choices and at a later date, will stage an Elective Workshop on the most requested topic. Individual business presentations may also be arranged.

Seminars offered under the BizSafe program include:

-  Preventing shoplifting and stealing
-  Preventing robbery
-  Preventing burglary
-  Personal safety for the business community
-  Preventing fraud
-  Risk management

Microdots

Protect your valuables with microdot property security

You work hard to acquire items of value in your home such as TVs, jewellery, computers and cameras, so it makes sense to take actions to protect your property.

Brisbane City Council offers all Brisbane households the opportunity to purchase a Microdot kit at a subsidised cost.



Microdots are micro-labels that come in an aerosol can and can be easily applied to any household item. Each kit has a unique PIN number that needs to be registered online upon application. If goods are stolen, this PIN number can assist police to identify stolen goods and provide a better chance of getting your items returned to you. If an item is marked with microdots, it will be detected using a UV light and microscope.

Grab your Microdot Kit Today

Microdots kits can be purchased from Council's Customer Service Centres, libraries and Regional Business Centres. You must be aged over 18 and a resident or ratepayer of Brisbane at the time of purchase.

Police believe this person pictured above may be able to assist police with their inquiries.

On Monday the April 26 around 1.55am an unidentified offender has entered the Lucky 7 convenience store in the McWhirters Building, Wickham Street, Fortitude Valley.

The offender has approached the male victim who was standing at the counter purchasing items. The victim was verbally abused before assaulted and pushed to the ground. The offender continued to assault the victim before leaving into the Brunswick Street Mall.

Brisbane City – Tuesday 11 May 2010

Around 5.50pm on May 11 a woman has attempted to steal a number of jumpers from the David Jones store in the Queen Street Mall.

When confronted by security the woman has assaulted two security officers.

She has damaged a pair of glasses before striking one officer in the head, groin and thigh area. She has then assaulted a second officer, striking the officer in the head and eye, causing them to fall to the ground.

The suspect has left the store on foot and headed towards Queen Street Mall and King George Square.

One of the security officers sustained serious injuries as a result of the assault.

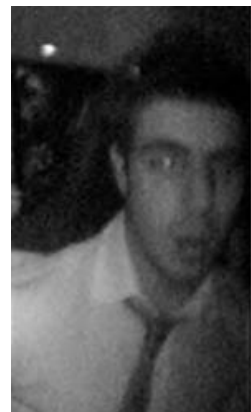
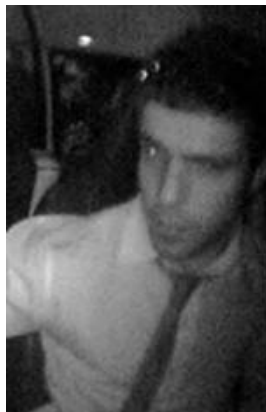

Lutwyche to Albion – Saturday 5 June 2010



Police believe this person pictured above may be able to assist police with their inquiries.

Police are looking for a man after a taxi driver was assaulted with a metal bar on June 5. Around 6pm the man was picked up at Lutwyche when he directed the cab driver to Albion Railway Station.

The man is described as having blonde hair, 182cm tall with a slim build, Caucasian appearance and around 23 years old. He was wearing dark long coloured pants, a white long sleeved shirt and tie.
